Please could take this opportunity to remind parents and carers of the following for the new academic year:

Uniform:

Mount St Joseph has an excellent reputation within the community. To maintain this, we need to ensure that uniform is of the highest standard. Please ensure you refer to the **school website** for the full school uniform list. I would like to highlight aspects of uniform around hair and jewellery – students are not permitted to wear any piercings, or have extreme hairstyles and colours.

Could I also remind you that when purchasing school trousers, they must be tailored trousers (not slim fit or jeans). Also, when buying school shoes, please ensure that they are shoes, not trainers as these are not acceptable (please see attached flyer for acceptable footwear). I look forward to your support in ensuring these high standards of uniform are adhered to. If you are unsure of any aspects of the school uniform, please do not hesitate to contact the school before you purchase the items.

Mobile phones:

In order to build on and develop student progress and attainment, we need to focus on all aspects associated with learning, eliminating distractions for students. I would like to request the support of parents/carers in reminding their child about mobile phones and other electrical devices; these should be switched off and kept out of sight during the school day. Students have been informed of the times and the zones where electrical devices are permitted. Students are also aware of the consequences for using electrical devices in classrooms or on corridors.

School Dinners

Regularly a number of students come into school without any money on their Parentmail account. Please ensure you top-up your child's account on a regular basis. Cash must <u>not</u> be sent into school. If you have not yet registered with Parentmail, please contact the school reception on 01204 391800 and an email or text will be sent out to enable you to do this. New Year 7 students will receive their registration details over the summer break.

Heathy Eating

We encourage all of our students to consume healthy food and drinks during the school day. All the meals and food served in the school canteen are all in line with the healthy schools' guidelines and policy. Please could I ask all parents and carers to remind your child that excessive amounts of unhealthy food i.e. large bags of crisps, chocolate and fizzy pop are not permitted in school. Also, energy drinks and drinks in glass bottles are also forbidden. If pupils do not adhere to the healthy eating policy, the items will be confiscated and parents will be invited into collect them.
