We all say; O God, come to our aid.


Gentle God, you invite me to come to you and receive your rest. Teach me your way of love, so, I can help lift the burdens of others.




Thursday 14th December

The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, [a] the Son of God, [b] ² as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way" [c]—

3 "a voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'" [d]

⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptised by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptise you with ^[e] water, but he will baptise you with ^[f] the Holy Spirit."



This week the Gospel reminds us of the baptism of Jesus. Why would Jesus want to be baptised if he was sinless, he did not need saving. Jesus is baptised to show us the right thing to do, to demonstrate that we will chose to obey the will of God.

We are a multi faith community, and some of you may be sat there thinking that this means nothing to you as you may not be Christian, but as with many religious teachings there is a universal theme.

All people of faith want to build a strong relationship with God, and this ultimately means following the teachings of the Holy books and guidance given. This can sometimes go against the way we live our lives, and it is not meant to be easy. To build a relationship with God requires a lifelong commitment, but it is worth the struggles.

In this Advent season let us be open to and guided by the message of the birth of a child, one who will go on to spread a message of universal love, peace and understanding.
